It took horrendous sacrifice for Robin Griffith's battalion to capture the city of Nasiriyah during the invasion of Iraq. Nineteen U.S. Marines died in a single day of the bitter weeklong battle.

Robin returned home unhurt from this battle. But during his second combat tour in war-torn Iraq, the blast of an enemy mortar sprayed shrapnel into his leg as well as many other parts of his body.

The blast nearly amputated Robin's arm, too! Today, he cannot move his elbow, and stabbing pains continue to sear through his arm. Burn scars cover one-third of his body.

But when asked if he'd change anything about the terrible sacrifice he made for our country, he shrugs it off. He says he'd only change the trajectory of the mortar that got him. That's it, nothing else.

*Robin would do it all over again for America, for you and me.*

Robin's patriotism sticks and will not let go ... like the enclosed labels, a free gift with no obligation. And I hope you'll use those patriotic labels to contact others and encourage them to honor our wounded warriors like Robin.

Describing his feelings after his injuries, Robin summed up the urgent need for your help: "I was scared I would not be able to work to provide for my young family. Everything had changed ... Instead of a confident young Marine, I was a disabled father and husband."

Robin cannot play the sports he used to love—basketball, football, and baseball—the same way he once did. But through WWP, you introduced him to new outdoor activities. He is now an avid golfer.

With renewed confidence, Robin is in college, studying history with an eye toward teaching or civil service. Last summer, he traveled a wide region of the country as part of an effort to bring Wounded Warrior Project services to others who suffered the tragic impact of today's wars.

And Robin loves bringing hope to others like himself. He says, "*When I'm able to help these guys who are just coming home with an injury, I can tell them, 'Hey look, I'm fine. You're going to be okay.' I feel like I'm doing what I need to be doing.*"

Robin explained why your support through the Wounded Warrior Project is critical: "*It's chaotic, coming back from Iraq or Afghanistan. It's such a big transition. The wounded have to be patient with their own recoveries, with their physical and mental health. WWP helps those who are wounded to see what they can do physically, and it helps mentally.*"
